REPORT OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

1. The Management Committee presents its report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2000.

- 3. State of affairs. Without the increase in value of the investment there would have been a deficit of £1 502 for the year 2000. This was because of:
- a loss of £1 797 on meetings/events arising from the increased costs in using the Conway Hall rather than the Swedenborg Hall and the need to hire equipment for several meetings
- increased production and postage costs for the magazines
- a reduction in subscription income
- spending on new activities: Saarbrücken and Graz competitions and coaching
- 4. Principal activity. The principal activity of the society is to encourage the appreciation and study of Richard Wagner's life and works.
- 5. Affiliation. The society is affiliated to the Richard Wagner Verband, the international organisation of Wagner societies.
- 6. Membership of the society: There were 1 092 members for 2000 of which 66 were resident outside the United Kingdom. For 1999 the comparable figures were 1 137 and 72. For this purpose joint members have been counted as a single member.

7. Management Committee. The members of the Management Committee, none of whom received any renumeration for his/her services, who served during the year were:
