OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES Principal objectives

The principal objectives of the charity are as follows:-

- 1) To advance education in and appreciation of the life and work of Richard Wagner.
- 2) To promote and organise public performances anywhere in the world of the works of Richard Wagner by the Society from time to time and for special purposes include in its programmes suitable works by other composers.
- 3) To promote and organise other cultural and educational activities relevant to the study and appreciation of the music of Richard Wagner.

Activities

To achieve the above objectives the Society:-

- 1. Arranges meetings, events and study days to enable members to further their understanding and appreciation of the life and works of Richard Wagner. It also arranges events at which singers, directors, conductors etc. of Wagner productions talk about and discuss their work.
- 2. Publishes at regular intervals the magazine, Wagner News, which is distributed free of charge to members.
- 3. Provides financial help to fund the coaching of young singers of Wagner and provides a bursary to enable a young singer to visit Bayreuth each August.
- 4. In association with organisations such as The Mastersingers Company provides opportunities for young singers to perform Wagner in public and to take part in competitions.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Review of activities for the year 2013

There were a number of changes to our committee during 2013. After a number of years as assistant programme director Gary Kahn resigned in June and our thanks are directed to him for providing such an interesting and varied programme during his term. Mike Morgan, our treasurer and ticket secretary decided to stand down at the end of the year. We were fortunate that three long-standing members of the society offered to serve on the committee. Emmanuelle Waters in January, Peter Leppard, who has taken on the role as event manager, in April and Neil King, our new treasurer, in December. Particular thanks should go to Margaret Murphy for her continuing efforts as membership secretary and dealing with tasks which sometime appear to take on Sisyphean proportions!

2013 being the bicentenary of Wagner's birth, the society supported and sponsored a number of events presented by **Wagner 200**.

To many members the highlight of the year was the presentation by Mastersingers of the *Inside The Ring* events at Blockley to coincide with and complement the Ring performances at nearby Longborough.

Peter Leppard, as events manager, in conjunction with The Mastersingers arranged support for the ever-popular autumn events, the Rehearsal Orchestra and our new Singing Competition as an alternative to the Bayreuth Bursary competition.

In summary our events in 2013 were as follows:

24 January A joint recital and dinner held with the Liszt, Alkan and Berlioz societies.

24 April The Dame Eva Turner Lecture –*Wagner in Practice*, given by Keith Warner. At the close Keith was presented with the Sir Reginald Goodall Memorial Award.

Financial review and investment policy

The principal source of income was from membership subscriptions received and by various donations. Members of the executive committee and others, including professionals, give their time voluntarily to the charity and often bear some of the incidental postage, stationery and travelling expenditure personally.

Income received is utilised against the principal objectives and the running costs of the charity.

Total income during the year amounted to £68,971. Direct charitable expenditure amounted to £86,500. To the deficit of £17,529 the charity's administration costs of £9,275 were deducted which leaves net outgoing resources for the year of $\pounds 26,804$.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES (CONTINUED)

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2013

The amount of £3,992, being a gain on the investment held, was deducted leaving a net deficit of £22,812 to be carried forward. Funds brought forward from previous years totalled £52,235, therefore total funds carried forward at 31 December 2013 totalled £29,423.

Full details of the financial results of the year are shown in the statement of financial activities on page 7.

There are no restrictions on the charity's power to invest. The investment strategy is set by the trustees and unrestricted funds are invested in an interest bearing 14 day notice account.

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the charity to maintain funds at a level sufficient to finance not less than twelve months of unrestricted expenditure and that this level of reserves is held throughout the year.

Risk management

The trustees actively review the major risks which the charity may face on a regular basis and believe that maintaining reserves at current levels, combined with an annual review of the controls over key financial systems, will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The trustees have also examined other operational and business risks faced by the charity and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate the significant risks.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The Trustees of the Wagner Society are required to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the movement of funds for that year. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:-

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and for safeguarding its assets.

REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT EXAMINER TO THE TRUSTEES OF.

I report on the accounts of The Wagner Society for the year ended 31 December 2013 which are set out on pages 7 to 12.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and the independent examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under Section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act)) and that an independent examination is needed.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2013

1. Accounting policies

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Charities Act 2011 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

Voluntary income

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Members' subscriptions are accounted for when they are receivable.

Donations and gifts are accounted for when they are received.

Income tax recoverable on members' subscriptions and donations is recognised when the claim is submitted to HMRC.

Legacies are accounted for as soon as the Committee is notified of its legal entitlement and the amount is due.

Income from investments

Dividends and interest are accounted for when receivable. Tax recoverable on such income is recognised in the same accounting year.

Gains and losses on investments

Realised gains or losses are recognized when investments are sold. Unrealised gains or losses are accounted for on revaluation of investments at 31st December.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets for use by the charity are stated at cost less depreciation.

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rate in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:-

Equipment

25% on cost

Stocks Stocks comprise opera tickets for resale.

Value added tax

Costs are inclusive of input value added tax not recoverable by the charity.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Funds held by the charity are either:-

Unrestricted funds – these are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds – these are funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when raised for particular restricted purposes.
